24 Timorese Trainees Graduate from the Second Electrical & Instrumentation Vocational Training Program

24 Timorese trainees from the second batch of the vocational training program conducted at the CNEFP-Tibar graduated today. They will now go on to industry placements and employment with a range of local organisations, and majority of the graduates have been successfully placed across industries in Timor-Leste.

The Level II Certificate in Electrical and Instrumentation training was developed by ConocoPhillips, representing the Bayu-Undan Joint Venture partners, the Autoridade Nacional do Petróleo e Minerais (ANPM) and SEPFOPE, and is jointly implemented by CNEFP-Tibar and CEGELEC Oil & Gas.

The 12-month course involved 6 months of theory and 6 months of practical in both disciplines.

As part of the training program curriculum, all graduates will continue an internship program with local organisations to gain industry exposure and to put what they have learnt into practice, with some are going directly into employment.

Today, a graduation ceremony is held at CNEFP-Tibar to recognize the success of the program's second trainee group. Recruitment has just started on 27 January 2020 for a third round of trainees, with the hope that the third group will commence their studies in March to November 2020.

Jose Lobato, ConocoPhillips Timor-Leste Country Manager, "ConocoPhillips and our JV partners are very proud to support this program and we look forward to seeing the graduates applying the skills and knowledge they have gained in their internships and future careers," Mr Lobato said.
